



**Regular Presentations** involve the author going up to the podium and delivering an oral presentation. We strongly encourage the distribution of hard copies during presentations. Such hard copies provide not only a summary of your work but also serve as a “business card” for those who are further interested in your research. Hard copies also guarantee that a presentation can go on in a meaningful fashion even if the technology (e.g., digital projector) doesn’t work.

The conference organizers will provide computers and digital projectors. Do not bring your own laptop for your presentation; instead bring a USB memory stick or a CD on which you would have saved your PowerPoint presentation. Linux and Mac users are asked to save their presentations in a compatible format. In the evolving world of Microsoft, save down to the 97-2003 format in order to ward off any problems.

Assume there will be no internet access or any presentation equipment for OHP acetates (a.k.a. transparencies) in the conference rooms.
